

**APPROVE EXERCISING THE SECOND OPTION TO EXTEND THE PRE-QUALIFICATION STATUS  
OF 126 MUSEUMS AND CULTURAL INSTITUTIONS**

**THE CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER REPORTS THE FOLLOWING DECISION:**

Approve exercising the second option to extend the pre-qualification status of 126 museums and cultural institutions to participate in the "Schools Without Walls" program to provide services to the Chicago Public Schools, with the total cost not to exceed \$3,000,000. "Schools Without Walls" is a resource guide designed to bring Chicago's museums and cultural institutions into the classrooms. Participating museums and cultural institutions provide curriculum development programs and focused field trips that are aligned with and support the Chicago Academic Standards (CAS). These museums and cultural institutions were chosen pursuant to a non-competitive selection process. A written document exercising the option is currently being negotiated. No services shall be provided by any participating museum or cultural institution and no payment shall be made prior to the execution of the master/option agreements. The pre-qualification status approved herein for each institution shall automatically rescind in the event such institution fails to execute the Board's master/option agreement within 120 days of the date of this Board Report. Information pertinent to the master agreement and the option agreements is stated below.

**ORIGINAL AGREEMENT:** The 89 original agreements (authorized by Board Report 99-1027-PR31) were for a term commencing October 1, 1999 and ending September 30, 2000, with two (2) options to extend for two additional one-year periods. The 37 new agreements (authorized by Board Report 00-0927-PR45) were for a term commencing on October 1, 2000 and ending September 30, 2001, with one (1) 12-month option to renew.

**OPTION PERIOD:** Pursuant to paragraph 4 of the original agreements, the term of each original agreement is being extended for one year commencing October 1, 2001 and ending September 30, 2002.

**OPTION PERIODS REMAINING:** There are no option periods remaining for participating institutions under the original agreements.

**SCOPE OF SERVICES:** "Schools Without Walls" is a comprehensive guide designed for teachers to bring the resources of Chicago's museums and cultural institutions into the classroom. This program is the result of collaboration between CPS and the city's cultural leaders with funding generously provided by the Terra Foundation for the Arts. This program will continue to provide vast resources and teacher workshops within the framework of the Chicago Academic Standards. Focused field trips and in-school programs will continue to enhance the educational experience for Chicago students as they develop visual and analytical skills through investigating original objects and exploring exciting exhibits. A resource guide is available to every teacher in the Chicago Public Schools.

**DELIVERABLES:** Museums and Cultural Institutions participating in this program will continue to provide resources, teacher workshops, professional development, educator previews of exhibits, focused field trips and in-school programs.

**OUTCOMES:** Schools working with the participating museums and cultural institutions will experience enhanced curriculum development strategies.

**COMPENSATION:** The sum of all payments to all pre-qualified museums and cultural institutions shall not exceed \$3,000,000 and the costs associated herewith shall be reported to the Board on a quarterly basis pursuant to Board Rule.

**USE OF THE POOL:** All Chicago Public Schools are authorized to receive services from the pre-qualified pool as follows: Each School shall select a museum or institution and evidence such selection by a purchase order for services, which purchase order shall reflect the dollar amount for the services selected, and which purchase order will be sent directly from each school to the selected museum or institution.

**AUTHORIZATION:** Authorize the General Counsel to include other relevant terms and conditions in the option document. Authorize the President and Secretary to execute the option documents.

**AFFIRMATIVE ACTION:** Pursuant to Section 3.7 of the M/WBE Plan, this contract is exempt from review under the M/WBE Plan due to the fact that this is a special Board of Education Initiative with Chicago Cultural Institutions and Museum.

**LSC REVIEW:** Local School Council approval is not applicable to this report.

**FINANCIAL:** Various school budget costs to be determined by each individual school upon selection of program participation.

**GENERAL CONDITIONS:**

Inspector General – Each party to the agreement shall acknowledge that, in accordance with 105 ILCS 5/34-13.1, the Inspector General of the Chicago Board of Education has the authority to conduct certain investigations and that the Inspector General shall have access to all information and personnel necessary to conduct those investigations.


Conflicts – The agreement shall not be legally binding on the Board if entered into in violation of the provisions of 105 ILCS 5/34-21.3 which restricts the employment of, or the letting of contracts to, former Board members during the one year period following expiration or other termination of their terms of office.

Indebtedness – The Board's Indebtedness Policy adopted July 26, 1995 (95-0726-EX3), as amended from time to time, shall be incorporated into and made a part of the agreement.




