## **OMNIBUS REPORT: AUTHORIZE THE ACCEPTANCE OF GRANTS**

THE CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER REPORTS THE FOLLOWING DECISION:

- The remaining funds shall be allowed for instructional resources that are consumable and directly support engaged-learning activities and standards-based approaches to instruction in the school curriculum.

To ensure that all private school children and their teachers and other educational personnel have an opportunity to participate in this program on an equitable basis, \$746,484 must be set-aside and used from the TLCF Grant award to support technology services in seventeen private school affiliations located within District #299.

Contingent Liability -- The agreement shall contain the clause that any expenditure beyond the current fiscal year is deemed to be a contingent liability, subject to appropriation in the subsequent fiscal year budget(s).
