

**AUTHORIZE ANTICIPATED PAYMENTS
FOR EDUCATIONAL SERVICES PROVIDED TO CHICAGO PUBLIC SCHOOLS STUDENTS
INSTRUCTED IN PSYCHIATRIC HOSPITALS**

THE CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER REPORTS THE FOLLOWING DECISION:

Authorize payment to the various hospitals and psychiatric treatment facilities identified below which provide short-term educational services to Chicago Public Schools students coordinated through the Board's Home Hospital Services during the FY2002. All facilities have provided such services to Chicago Public Schools during the last 2 fiscal years. The total cost of these services is approximate because these services must be provided on an "as needed" basis. Total anticipated cost for FY2002 should not exceed \$140,000.00. No written agreements are required for these services.

SCOPE OF SERVICES: Students may be admitted to hospitals in and around Chicago, as determined by or recommended by each student’s legal guardian, court order or physician. The Board must provide educational services to these students during their hospital stay per Illinois Administrative Code (Chapter 1 Section 226.335) which states “The Home and Hospital Services [program] shall be provided to any child with a health or physical impairment which, in the opinion of a licensed medical examiner, will cause an absence from school for more than two consecutive weeks, and for whom school personnel determine that such a program can be of educational benefit.” These hospitals will provide educational services and be reimbursed by the Board.

DELIVERABLES: Academic instruction provided at various hospitals in and around Chicago by Illinois State certified teachers to District 299 students.

OUTCOMES: Students receiving instruction at the hospitals and psychiatric treatment facilities will be able to transition back into the classroom at their local schools with minimum difficulties.

COMPENSATION: Educational services may be provided by appropriate educational services staff in each of the listed facilities at a daily rate not to exceed \$20.00 per day per child, including:

GENERAL CONDITIONS:

Inspector General – Each party to the agreement shall acknowledge that, in accordance with 105ILCS 5/34-13.1, the Inspector General of the Chicago Board of Education has the authority to conduct certain investigations and the Inspector General shall have access to all information and personnel necessary to conduct those investigations.


Conflicts – The agreement shall not be legally binding on the Board if entered into in violation of the provisions of I05ILCS 5/34-21.3 which restricts the employment of, or the letting of contracts to, former Board Members during the one-year period following expiration or other termination of their terms of office.

Indebtedness – The Board's Indebtedness Policy adopted July 26, 1995 (95-0726-EX3), as amended from time to time, shall be incorporated into and made a part of the agreement.


Ethics – The Board's Ethics Code adopted September 27, 1995 (95-0927-RU3), as amended from time to time shall be incorporated into and made a part of the agreement.

Contingent Liability – The agreement shall contain the clause that any expenditure beyond the current fiscal year is deemed a contingent liability, subject to appropriation in the subsequent fiscal year budget(s).




