**AMEND BOARD REPORT 04-1027-RS3**  
**RESOLUTION REQUEST THE PUBLIC BUILDING COMMISSION OF CHICAGO TO**  
**UNDERTAKE THE DESIGN AND CONSTRUCTION OF A NEW WESTINGHOUSE HIGH SCHOOL**

**WHEREAS**, on July 12, 1956, the Board of Education of the City of Chicago (the "Board") joined in the organization of the Public Building Commission of Chicago (the "PBC"); and

**WHEREAS**, the PBC provides a means of facilitating the acquisition, construction and improvement of public improvements, buildings and facilities for use by various governmental agencies in the furnishing of essential governmental, educational, health, safety and welfare services; and

**WHEREAS**, the Board has heretofore participated in the acquisition and construction of public schools and other facilities to provide essential governmental services in cooperation with the PBC and various other governmental agencies; and

**WHEREAS**, the Board has determined that it is necessary, desirable, advantageous, and in the public interest to undertake various capital projects in conjunction with the PBC and other governmental agencies; and

**WHEREAS**, the projects would maximize the utilization of educational facilities operated and maintained by the Board by providing new school educational options and enhanced recreational and other facilities and improving the community areas located in the vicinity of school property; and

**WHEREAS**, the estimated total cost of the construction of a new Westinghouse High School (the "Project") is anticipated not-to-exceed ~~\$63,000,000~~ \$102,917,200 of which the Board has or will incur approximately ~~\$3,000,000~~ \$6,500,200 of Project-related costs directly while the portion of the Project to be undertaken by the PBC is anticipated to be ~~\$60,000,000~~ \$96,417,000.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE CHICAGO BOARD OF EDUCATION:**

1. The PBC is hereby requested to complete the design of and then to construct a new school called Westinghouse High School on behalf of the Board. The Chief Fiscal Officer and the Chief Operating Officer are hereby authorized to deliver a Project Notification to the PBC, as defined in the Intergovernmental Agreement between the Board and the PBC, dated February 24, 1999 (the "IGA").
2. The Board has acquired or is in the process of acquiring the land for the New Westinghouse High School. The Board has completed the programming of the new school. The transfer package for the design of the new school is in process. The PBC is directed to provide any and all site preparation (including enrollment in the Site Remediation Plan, if necessary), to complete architectural design of the school, to bid the Project to its pre-qualified pool of general contractors, to award the Project to the lowest responsible bidder and to oversee construction of the Project.
3. The Board, in accordance with the terms of the IGA and the Memorandum of Understanding between the Board and the PBC, dated May 1, 2001, will transfer to the PBC the funds necessary to complete the Project identified above. The total cost for the Project to be undertaken by the PBC shall not exceed ~~\$60,000,000~~ \$96,417,000. This dollar amount is necessary to cover all Projects costs, including environmental, site preparation, construction, contingency, architectural fees, and management fees. Funding for the Project will be funded with ~~Fiscal Year 04 Board of Education Capital Funds. To the extent that Tax Increment Financing ("TIF") or PBC Surplus Funds become available, the Board reserves the right to supplant Fiscal Year 04 Board Capital Funds with TIF funds or PBS Surplus Funds.~~ the City of Chicago TIF backed bonds and FY07 and prior year Board of Education Capital Funds.

4. No cost may be incurred in excess of the level set forth in paragraph 3 above without prior Board approval.
5. The Board's General Counsel is hereby authorized to execute an assignment to the PBC of any and all contracts entered into by the Board in connection with this Project and to execute any and all other documents necessary to effectuate this transfer.
6. This resolution is effective immediately upon its adoption.
