# SY2015-2016 Proposed CPS Calendar for Elementary and High Schools

November 2014



## Calendar Details

This schedule proposes that the Chicago Board of Education establish a 2015-2016 School Year Calendar for Elementary, Middle and High Schools on a 208-day schedule, with the following components:

#### 208-day Schedule (Calendar Components):

- 178 full student attendance days
- 4 paid teacher institute days for eligible employees
- 3 paid school improvement days for eligible employees
- 3 paid professional development (PD) days for eligible employees
- 2 parent-teacher conference days
- 8 paid staff holidays for eligible employees
- 10 paid vacation days for eligible employees





## Key Differences from Last Year's Calendar

This version of proposed calendar is different from the 2014-2015 School Year Calendar in the following ways:

- August 26, 2015 start date for school clerks,
- August 31, 2015 start date for teachers and Paraprofessionals and School Related Personnel (PSRPs) and,
- September 8, 2015 (the day after Labor Day) start date for students.
- Spring Break occurs in the third full week of April (April 18-22, 2015)





### Considerations

- Provide consistency with last year's calendar
- Ensure the first day of class for students is the first Tuesday after Labor Day
- Distribute the number of days evenly across each quarter
- Ensure Spring Break occurs in April to accommodate end of year testing
