Responding to COVID-19



Since March 17, we've provided 12,534,573 grab-and-go meals across the district.

Meal Distribution


Nutrition Support Services has provided uninterrupted Meal Distribution since the school closure started on March 17

- Meals for 3 days (breakfast and lunch; 6 meals total) are packaged for pickups at schools and available **Monday-Friday from 9:00am 1:00pm**
- The program included pick-up at over 500 schools for the first 3 weeks of the closure as well as home delivery.
- During Spring Break week, over 140 schools served as meal distribution sites Monday-Thursday.
- Post-Spring Break (started Monday, April 13), **300 schools** are serving as meal distribution sites Monday-Friday. This results in:
 - 58% of CPS schools offering free meals still under this consolidation
 - 90% of all students will live within one mile of a meal distribution site
 - 75% of sites will be located on the south and west sides of the city
- Free meal delivery continues for families who need additional support

Facilities Cleaning

The CPS Facilities Department has engaged in three levels of cleaning since the beginning of the COVID-19 outbreak:

Type of cleaning	Use case	Description	Status
Enhanced Cleaning	Utilized when school is/was in session	Exceeds typical routine cleaning program; Cleaning protocols designed to prevent the spread of the virus	Completed

COVID-19 Expenses

To date, CPS estimates spending approximately \$44 million to address the COVID-19 pandemic; about \$9 million of this spending is above-and-beyond the district's regular contracts.

Remote Learning

CPS continues to strengthen Remote Learning Practices:

- Enacting systems to track student contact and engagement
- Released guidance to support student grading and engaging service providers
- ODLSS released Remote Learning Guidance Document
- Providing ongoing professional learning for school leaders and educators

Supports for families without digital access:

- Created Pre-K activity packets available at food distribution and devices that are available in English and Spanish
- Special education <u>cluster packet</u> available for pick-up or download on district remote learning page
- Book distribution: Distributed new books to families from 50 food distribution sites to support abundant student reading during closure

Remote Learning - CPS TV

Thanks to the Children First Fund, additional educational resources are now available through four local television stations: **WLS, Univision/UniMás, WCIU** and **WTTW.**

- Safari Montage, one of the primary partners in CPS' Curriculum Equity Initiative, is providing the digital content for the broadcasts in both English and Spanish
- Members of the Marketing and Curriculum, Instruction and Digital Learning (CIDL) teams are collaborating to develop the segments for math, English language arts, science, social science, world languages, and health & wellness
- WTTW has reorganized its digital subchannel to focus on educational content geared toward students in middle grades
- Content is airing on UniMás M-F (7 8 a.m.), on WCIU M-F (10 a.m. - noon), and on WLS (Localish) M-F (noon - 3 p.m.)

End of Year Graduation Celebrations

- Despite the public health emergency, the Class of 2020 is poised to graduate in a few short weeks
- Schools are encouraged to hold virtual graduation ceremonies for Pre-K, 8th, and 12th grades.
 - Materials will be distributed ahead of ceremonies
 - Social media can be used to promote and celebrate
 - Parental consent will be required for students under age 18
- Additionally, the Graduating Class of 2020 is invited to a Citywide Virtual Commencement Event featuring several high profile guests
