Fall Opening | Return to Five Days a Week

Schools will be open five days per week next school year

District Priorities

- 1. Develop guidance for schools/families on what in-person learning will look like
 - **Masks:** All students, staff, and visitors to school buildings will wear masks indoors at all times (except when eating or drinking), regardless of vaccination status.
 - **Social distancing:** We will work to keep three feet of space between students whenever possible.
 - **Daily meals:** Students may eat in the cafeteria or in their classrooms, depending on what works best for their individual schools.
- 2. Plan a centralized virtual option for students who are medically fragile or at-risk
- **3.** Implement innovative approaches for students to virtually take supplemental courses that are not offered at their schools
- **4.** Engage families and advocate for in-person instruction

- Our FACE and nursing teams are reaching out to students with known medical conditions through calls, texts, and emails, and disseminating information to medical and community groups.
- Students who apply and meet the criteria of medically fragile will be enrolled in the Virtual Academy.

As of July 20, Nearly HALF (47%) of Chicago residents aged 12-17 have received at least one dose of COVID-19 vaccine.

Phase 2 - Key Strategies

While Phase 1 focused on identification of most at risk students, the overall goal of Phase 2 of Re-engagement efforts is to re-establish communication and engage students in summer programming, with the ultimate goal of strong Day 1 attendance

To do this, we are employing the following strategies:

2.	Home visits for most at risk students (Options, Charter, District) - engage in back to school, summer, wraparound supports	One-to-One interventions - ~18,000 students		
3.	Parent phone banking - engage in back-to-school and wraparound supports	All students at 160 highest need schools (approximately 75,000 students)		
4.	CBO canvassing to promote back-to-school and COVID-19 vaccination information	Highest need community areas (10 community areas identified)
