CPS is offering new and expanded summer programs to support students

Programs are designed to:

1. Address student academic needs
2. Support students during academic transitions
3. Meet students' particular interests

Types of Summer Programs

Academic Programs

- Centrally managed/resourced programs designed to meet specific student academic needs
- Specific eligibility criteria

Transition-focused Programs

- Centrally resourced programs focused on supporting students who are entering a critical transition period

School-designed Programs

- School-selected programs designed by schools based on student interests

Academic Programs - Elementary School

Programs Type/Name	Program Description	Dates, Days & Times
Elementary Academic Programs		
Bridge+ (Grades K–8)	In-person math and reading intervention at 80 host sites for K-8 students with a D or F average for Q1-3 in Chicago Reading Framework or Math Standards. The program will also incorporate resources to address students' social emotional needs, as well dedicated time for arts, STEM and physical activity.	July 6 - 30 (Mon–Fri) 8:00 - 12:00 Or 9:30 - 1:30
OLCE Summer Support (ELs Grades K-3)	Summer instruction at 49 <u>host sites</u> for ELs in grades K-3 with low English Literacy proficiency (literacy proficiency level of 3.4 or below on ACCESS or WIDA Screener) to improve academic outcomes and increase student's English language proficiency levels.	July 6- July 30 (Mon–Fri) 3.0 hours
Extended School Year (ESY) (Pre-K–12)	For all Pre-K–12 students who are eligible for ESY as indicated in their IEP. Students continue their learning at 96 <u>host sites</u> for 4 or 6 weeks during the summer to reduce summer learning loss. Families will have the option to extend ESY 2 weeks beyond IEP eligibility for ESY up to 8 weeks.	June 28–Aug 19 (Mon–Thur) 4- and 6-week 4.0 hours

Academic Programs - High School

Programs Type/Name	Program Description	Dates, Days & Times
High School Academic Programs		
Credit Recovery (Grades 9–12)	All high schools will provided the opportunity to host in-person credit recovery for courses needed to meet graduation requirements. This program is available to all high school students who did not pass the course during the school year. Traditional virtual credit recovery will also be offered.	July 6 - August 6 (Mon–Fri) 2.5 hours
OLCE ESL Credit Attainment (ELs 11-12)	The HS ESL Credit Attainment summer course is for ELs who anticipate missing course credits required for graduation, not due to failing grades, but because of their late enrollment in a U.S. high school. Priority is given to graduating seniors needing ESL credit.	July 6- August 6 (Mon–Fri) 3.0 hours
Summer of Algebra (Incoming Gr9)	For rising freshmen at select high schools to provide a rigorous Algebra experience that better prepares them for success on their pathway to advanced mathematics coursework in high school.	July 12-August 6 (Mon–Fri) 4.5 hours
Exigent Math	Mathematics enrichment opportunity for students at <u>select sites</u> to better prepare them for 8th grade algebra or 12th grade calculus.	July 12-Aug 6

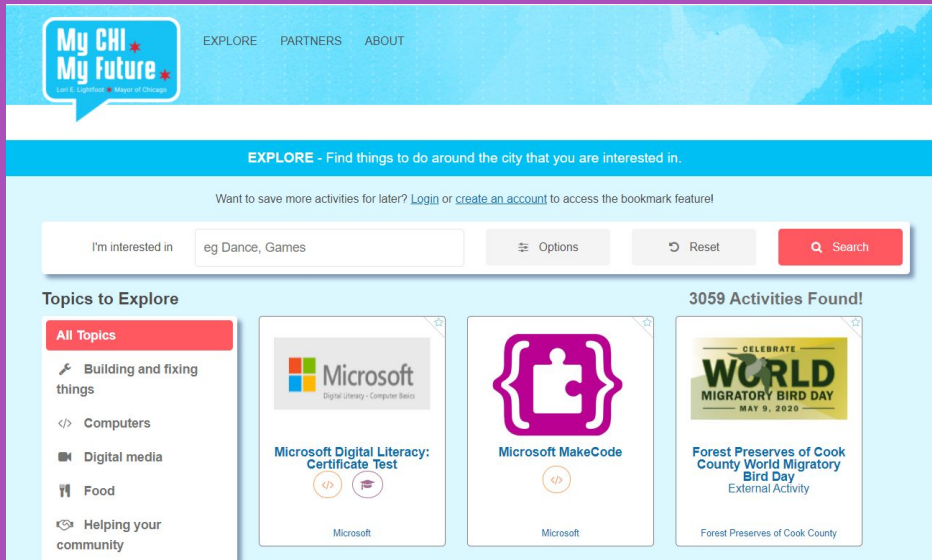
Programs Type/Name	Program Description	Dates, Days & Times
Elementary School Transition Focused Programs		
Kick-off to Kindergarten (Rising Kindergarteners)	CPS preschool students and incoming Kindergarten students who have not previously attended school further develop math and reading skills necessary for Kindergarten at their own school	Flexible, Should follow Summer Bridge Schedule when possible July 6 - 30 (Mon–Fri) 8:00 - 12:00 or 9:30 - 1:30
Preview to Pre-K (Incoming Pre-K students)	For students entering preschool to ease the transition from home to their own school. Activities emphasize social-emotional learning, community building and engaging enrichment.	Flexible, must begin after 7/6/21 Up to 4 hours/day

Transition Focused Programs - High School

Programs Type/Name	Program Description	Dates, Days & Times
High School Transition Focused Programs		
Freshman Connection (Incoming Gr9)	Enrichment program for incoming freshmen designed to improve school engagement and on-track metrics.	4 weeks between July 6 - August 13
Sophomore Connection (Incoming Gr10)	Transition support program for rising 10th graders who didn't benefit from FC and have spent most of this year remote. SC will include time for credit recovery. (open to all, target at-risk students)	4 weeks between July 6 - August 13 Days & Hours vary by schools
Diverse Learner Post-2° Transition (Gr12 w/IEP not in ESY)	Support for 2021 graduates and 12th grade students with an IEP not eligible for ESY. Participants will engage in a two-week program that is focused on postsecondary transition skills.	June 28 - July 9 *hours based on site/transportation
Extended Postsecondary Transition (Graduating seniors)	Formerly called "Summer Melt," Postsecondary Transition Coordinators facilitate school-based support designed to ensure high school graduates have completed the necessary steps to pursue their concrete postsecondary plans. This programming will be the foundation of Alumni Persistence & Success work for the district.	June 21 - August 27 Days & Hours vary by school

District Priorities

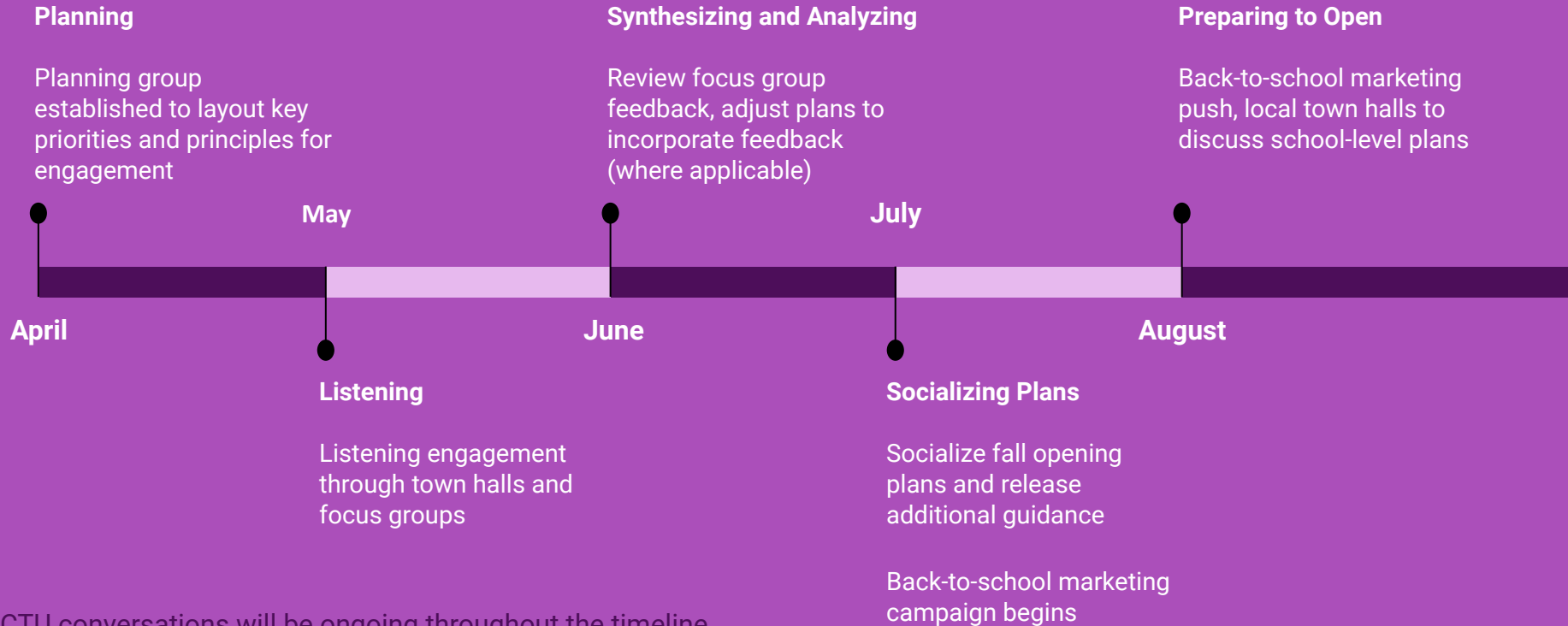
1. Develop guidance for schools/families on what in-person learning will look like
