President del Valle took the Chair and the meeting being called to order there were then:

President del Valle provided the following remarks:

I'm very pleased to be convening today's meeting. As you know, we canceled last month's meeting due to the strike. Over the course of that strike I saw many things that stood out. I saw true passion for improving our students' educational experience from everyone involved, from CTU, to SEIU, to CPS, and the Mayor's Office staff and to the Mayor. That makes me hopeful. And while parents, teachers, principals, and staff and students all experienced challenging times over the course of the strike, through that sacrifice, and it was a sacrifice for all involved, today the Board is being asked to vote on an agreement that addresses things that have never even been on the negotiating table before. And I say that in a positive sense. I want to thank Chief McDade, Chief Rivera and Chief Lyons, I know how much time you spent at the table and how little your families saw you over the past few months. I also want to thank Dr. Jackson for her leadership during this difficult time. During such a tense time, it can be easy to get frustrated, and be negative. These last few months I have seen Dr. Jackson exhibit exemplary leadership as she made sure to remind us every day that we are one family and that we all want the same thing, the best for our students. Again, there were great sacrifices made by all those involved, but the end result is that we've opened a new chapter, one that will over the next five years improve CPS services for students, families and the neighborhoods they live in.

While the Board did not have a direct role in negotiations, were kept up to date. We consulted regularly on a daily basis with staff, and so we were fully informed on an ongoing basis. But having said that, we will have a direct role in ensuring that the agreement is fully implemented. The Board will also have a role in maximizing the use of available resources to meet our obligations under this new contract, as well as advocating for the additional resources needed to keep u on the path of academic growth. We must continue our upward trajectory. Because of the work of all involved during this process, CPS, CTU, SEIU, advocates, our students, the community, our system will be stronger.

I would now like to ask Board Members if they have any comments at this time.

RESOLUTION RATIFY APPOINTMENT OF DWAYNE TRUSS TO THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE PUBLIC SCHOOL TEACHERS' PENSION AND RETIREMENT FUND OF THE CITY OF CHICAGO

WHEREAS, under 40 ILCS 5/17-137, the Board of Education of the City of Chicago appointment of its members to the Board of Trustees of the Public School Teachers' Pension and Retirement Fund of the City of Chicago (CTPF); and

WHEREAS, on June 28, 2019, the Board of Education notified CTPF that Board member Dwayne Truss was appointed to fill the unexpired term of Mark Furlong for a term beginning on June 26, 2019 and ending October 31, 2019; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE CITY OF CHICAGO:

Dwayne Truss is hereby reappointed to the Board of Trustees of the Public Schools Teachers' Pension and Retirement Fund of the City of Chicago effective November 1, 2019 and ending October 31, 2021.

RESOLUTION ADOPTING THE AMENDED ANNUAL SCHOOL BUDGET FOR FISCAL YEAR 2020

WHEREAS, on August 28, 2019, pursuant to Section 34-43 of the Illinois School Code (the "Code"), the Board of Education of the City of Chicago (the "Board") adopted an Annual School Budget for Fiscal Year 2020 (the "Budget"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 34-47 of the Code the Board may amend its budget by the same procedure provided for the adoption of the original budget; and

WHEREAS, the Board wishes to amend the Budget adopted on August 28, 2019 to include updates to the Budget which reflect the agreements reached with the Chicago Teachers Union (CTU) and the Service Employees International Union (SEIU); and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE CITY OF CHICAGO as follows:

Section 1. Findings. It is found, declared and determined as follows.

(a) Pursuant to section 34-43 of the Code, the Board has previously established standards by which its budgets shall be balanced in each fiscal year, consistent with the requirements of the Code. These standards and policies referenced by the Board in the August 28, 2019 resolution approving the Budget (19-0828-RS2) remain in force and govern this Amended Budget.

(b) The amended annual school budget for Fiscal Year 2020 (the "Amended Budget") was prepared in tentative form by the Board and was available for public inspection for at least fifteen days prior to adoption (to wit, since November 5, 2019) by having at least five copies of the tentative budget on file in the Office of the Board and was posted November 5, 2019, on the district's website at <u>www.cps.edu/budget</u>.

(c) On November 12, 2019, two public hearings were held concerning the adoption of the Amended Budget for Fiscal Year 2020, notice of such hearings having been given by publication on November 6, 2019, in a newspaper of general circulation in the City of Chicago and posting on the www.cpsboe.org website.

Section 2. Budget Approval. The Amended Annual School Budget for Fiscal Year 2020, incorporating <u>Exhibit A</u> of this Resolution and the website at <u>http://cps.edu/FY20Budget</u>, is adopted.

Section 3. Severability. To the extent that any prior resolution or policy of the Board (excluding Board Rules) is in conflict with the provisions of this Resolution, the provisions of this Resolution shall be controlling. If any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this Resolution shall be held invalid, the invalidity of such section, paragraph, clause, or provision shall not affect any of the other provisions of this Resolution. This resolution incorporates by reference the provisions in the resolution approved on August 28, 2019 (19-0828-RS2).

Section 4. Effectiveness. This Resolution is effective immediately upon its adoption.

DESCRIPTION: The Fund is a pension fund established and operated pursuant to Article 8 of the Illinois Pension Code (40 ILCS 5/8-101 et seq.) (the "Code"). Pursuant to the Code, certain employees and retired employees of the City ("City Employees") and certain employees and retired employees of the Board of Education ("Board of Education Employees"), among others, are entitled to be paid certain annuities and benefits by the Fund. The Board of Education will reimburse the City the amount of the City's required contribution under Section 5/8-173 of the Code attributable to the annuities and benefits for Board of Education Employees.

If, at any time, Vendor identifies a situation where the current physical or sexual safety of a student or minor may be in question, Vendor will immediately notify the OIG.

Any additional investigative work will be performed by the Vendor on an as-needed basis, as determined by the OIG. This work may include acquiring evidence, performing legal analysis, conducting interviews and/or any other tasks necessary to ensure that the case is sufficiently investigated and resolved.

DELIVERABLES:

Vendor will first prioritize case files from highest to lowest risk. Vendor will review case files according to established review protocol and prepare monthly progress reports summarizing its findings and identifying areas of concern for further review and/or remedial action. Vendor will complete review of case and provide a summary report containing analysis and identifying critical cases. Vendor will provide investigative plans for all cases where OIG has determined additional investigative work required. Vendor will then conduct investigative work as requested by the OIG to ensure cases are sufficiently investigated and resolved. Vendor will prepare investigative report summarizing its investigative work when required.

OUTCOMES:

Vendor's services will result in a thorough and independent review of all identified CPS sexual abuse investigations from 2000 through 2018. Upon completion of Vendor's case review and reports. CPS will gain insight into effectiveness and appropriateness of the prior investigations. Vendor's reinvestigation of cases, if needed, will ensure that all necessary corrective actions are taken.

COMPENSATION:

Vendor shall be paid as follows: Estimated annual costs for the one (1) year term as set forth in the agreement. \$350,000 FY 2020 \$200,000 FY 2021

AUTHORIZATION:

Authorize the General Counsel to include other relevant terms and conditions in the written agreement. Authorize the President and Secretary to execute the agreement. Authorize the Inspector General to execute all ancillary documents required to administer or effectuate this agreement.
