Building a Safe, Supportive District Culture:

Title IX School Representatives

In SY18-19, CPS launched a strategic effort to empower educators as Title IX School Representatives at each school. These Title IX School Representatives are trained to identify, respond, and prevent sexual misconduct concerns. They are responsible for:

- Working with OSP and the Office of Inspector General (OIG) to help schools respond to incidents of sexual misconduct;
- Attending specialized training sessions annually to increase their student protections and Title IX expertise;
- Communicating information related to Title IX to their school's staff and students;
- Supporting students affected by sexual misconduct.






Title IX School Representatives: 97% Compliance Rate

OSP trained 500+ Title IX School Representatives from district-run schools.


OSP is currently training Title IX School Representatives from charter schools.


94% of OSP Investigations are Closed








Majority of 3,270 Reports to OSP are Student Misconduct






Student Allegation Types from 9/4/18 – 7/15/19








Adult Allegation Types from 9/4/18 – 7/15/19
