Building a Safe, Supportive District Culture: Coalition with Citywide Partners

Mission of the Coalition: Create a cross-institutional response team to support and advocate for students impacted by sexual violence within CPS.

Goals of the Coalition: Developing effective resources and written procedures for referral, electronic materials, and a referral list; group members will also be invited to train OSP staff on their services and expertise.

Membership of the Coalition: This group will consist of representatives from the Chicago Children's Advocacy Center, Resilience, YWCA, Youth Outreach Services, and Mujeres Latinas en Accion. The group meets monthly from January- June of 2019, with the possibility of continuation as needed.

Upcoming Trainings

- **Protecting Chicago Children's 2.0 Training:** Updating webinar to ensure all staff are cognizant of appropriate reporting procedures of allegations of sexual misconduct and remaining compliant with Title IX
- Illinois Mandated Reporter Training: Will ensure all staff complete the training.
- Departments:
 - Office of Safety and Security: Security Staff
 - Office of Sports Administration: All athletic coaches and directors

Ongoing & Completed Trainings

- Title IX School Representative Trainings for District-Run Schools (12/20/18 Ongoing)
- Parent Support Center (2/14/19): Trained team on how to support and assist parents regarding allegations of sexual misconduct
- Office of Social Emotional Learning (3/7/19): Trained Specialists and other team members on collaboration opportunities, terminology, and appropriate reporting procedures


Working to Pass Legislation to Protect Students Across Illinois

CPS is working closely with members of the General Assembly to bring forward legislation that will protect students across the state, this includes: calling for more frequent re-checks of backgrounds of employees of school districts; we are asking that licenses of teachers who have been dismissed by school districts for physical or sexual acts with students be suspended pending revocation and immediately upon dismissal; and we are requesting prohibition on releasing disciplinary information that is 4 or more years old be eliminated.





96% of OSP Investigations are Closed




344 Total OSP Investigations

2,048 Total Reports from 9/4/18 - 3/31/19


- 200 Reports of Adult Misconduct involving CPS Adults (9.8%)


Cases by Issue Type from 9/4/18 - 3/31/19







Reports of Adult Misconduct



450 Total Reports of Adult Misconduct from 9/4/18 - 3/31/19

- CPS Adults:
 - CPS Employee Adults = 185 (48.4%)
 - CPS Vendor Adults = 15 (3.9%)
- Non-CPS Adults:
 - Home-Based or Family Adults = 109 (28.5%)
 - Community-Based Adults = 73 (19.1%)
